

## Aims and scope

INTERNATIONAL MICROBIOLOGY, the official journal of the Spanish Society for Microbiology (SEM), aims to advance and disseminate information in the fields of basic and applied microbiology among scientists around the world. The journal publishes two kinds of contributions: Articles (reviews, research articles, and research notes) and Complements (editorials, perspectives, opinions, book reviews, obituaries, etc). A feature of INTERNATIONAL MICROBIOLOGY that distinguishes it from many other microbiology journals is a broadening of the term "microbiology" to include eukaryotic microorganisms (protists, yeast, molds), as well as the publication of articles about microbiologists and their work and questions related to the history and sociology of this science. It offers short publication times and a complete copy-editing service. The journal encourages submissions in the following areas:

- Microorganisms (prions, viruses, bacteria, archaea, protists, yeast, molds)
- Microbial biology (taxonomy, genetics, morphology, physiology, ecology, pathogenesis)
- Microbial applications (environmental, soil, industrial, food and medical microbiology, biodeterioration, bioremediation, biotechnology)
- State of the art of microbiology in different regions of the world
- Outstanding microbiologists
- Microbiology and education
- The history and sociology of microbiology

## Copyright

Submission of a manuscript to INTERNATIONAL MICROBIOLOGY implies: that the work described has not been published before, including publication on the World Wide Web (except in the form of an Abstract or as part of a published lecture, review, or thesis); that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere; that all coauthors have agreed to its publication. The corresponding author signs for and accepts responsibility for releasing this material and will act on behalf of any and all co-authors regarding the editorial review and publication processes.

If an article is accepted for publication in INTERNATIONAL MICROBIOLOGY, the authors (or other copyright holder) must transfer to the journal the copyright, which covers the right—not exclusive—to reproduce and distribute the article including reprints, translations, photographic reproductions microform, electronic form (offline, online) or any other

reproductions of similar nature. Nevertheless, all articles in INTERNATIONAL MICROBIOLOGY will be available on the internet to any reader at no cost.
